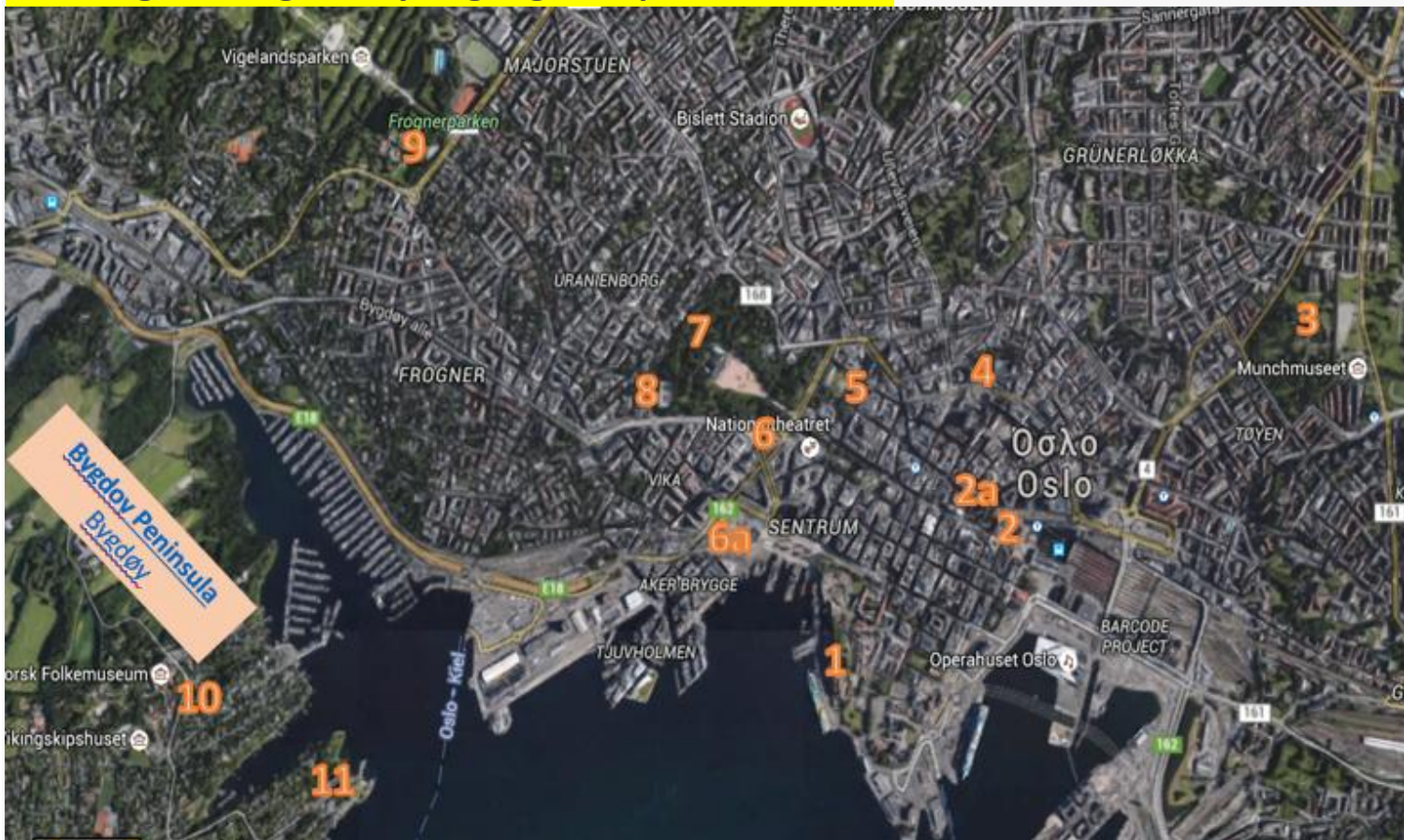


Oslo Sightseeing survey at google maps, as listed s/n



Trimmed by fjords and forests, Oslo is an excellent city break whether you like bustling nightlife or bunking outdoors. Sightseeing here means museums, galleries, and Scandinavian design. Whether you have a long trip or a short tour, check out our guide.

Total distance between Oslo's sightseeings 18.8 Km (start from First Millenium Hotel & back), but if you visit s/n 9-11 by car, then the distance between s/n 1-8 is reduced to 7.5 Km.

Oslo Sightseeing



1. *** Akershus Fortress

This medieval castle, built around 1290 to protect Oslo and Norway, is beautiful inside and out. **One of the best things to do in Oslo** if you love history or historic buildings.

Cool place to walk around the fort. **It's nothing spectacular, but it gave a nice view of the harbor.** If you're looking for good waterside hangouts, I would recommend walking over (about 5-10 min away) to the Opera house where you can walk on the roof.



2. [Oslo Cathedral](#) a lovely cathedral. Just for the architecture, it is worth a visit and it is free.

3. [Botanical Gardens \(Botanisk Hage og Museum\) & Natural History Museum](#) **In the best park in Oslo.**

In summer there is an abundance of flowers, plants and trees. You make the trip through the park in 1-2 hours.

2.4 Km from Akershus Fortress, Via Kongens Gate-right at Karl Johans Gate-Kirkegata (with two beautiful churches in the park on the right) -Storgata-at Trondheimsveien No 24 is the western entrance of the park.



4. Margareta Kyrkan - The Church of Sweden (?)

This quaint church was built at the start of the last century as tribute to the many Swedish settlers in Oslo. An example of neo-classical architecture, it's open each morning.



5. National Art Museum Oslo

Start your visit with one of the most famous artworks in the world: Munch's The Scream. The museum also has Norway's largest collection of paintings, drawings, and sculptures.



6. National Theater

The theatre had its first performance on 1 September 1899 but can trace its origins to Christiania Theatre, which was founded in 1829.



6a. Nobels Fredssenter

7. Royal Palace Oslo

Guided tours of the Royal Palace Oslo are available in the summer and cost 85 to 95 Kroner. Tours last an hour and take in the state rooms, parlors and banqueting halls.



8. [The Norwegian Parliament](#) The name of parliament in Norwegian is "Storting", which I think translates literally as "Big Thing". The building's attractions are evident from the photo. What goes on inside is arguably more important than the appearance of the outside, but this is a country where the only real problem is how to spend the money. If you want to see stunning interiors in Oslo, try the City Hall which is a must see.



9. **Frogner Park** and **Vigelands park** 3.5 Km (by car) W from **First Hotel Millennium** (GPS ok)

Less tourism, more relaxation. View the Vigeland Installation, and many other sculptures, or simply spend a few hours in peace, surrounded by nature. Take the no. 11 tram.

The Vigelandsparken is a really impressive and enjoyable park to visit. We took a bus out to the park. There are actually two locations that you can get off to enter the park. We got off at the second one which is right at the large gates entering the park with the full expanse of the sculptures laid out before you like an avenue. There was a toilet for a pit stop before heading on to the park. The sculptures and the park setting are really impressive. I would highly recommend that you either bring some information with you, or read before going here in order to really benefit from the park. There is a lot of impressive art and just ten minutes reading will really enhance your visit. This is a free tourist attraction in Norway

10. The Norwegian Museum of Cultural History wonderful museum with lovely collections and an enchanting outdoor park. If you like traditional architecture, furniture and interiors this place is for you

11. The Fram Museum 8 Km (by car) SW from First Hotel Millennium Dedicated to Polar explorations, this maritime museum is a favourite with kids, who love exploring the huge ship. In summer, catch a ferry from City Hall for a themed journey!

(on Bygdoy Peninsula is very close to Oslo downtown, just a 10 minute bus ride. There are interesting museums about Norwegian history, vikings, ships but the best is the great view of Oslo while you walk along the shore)
